

Worcester Re-enactors present Living History in Worcester 6 Saturday 20th February 2010

Show Times

At the Guildhall - opened by the mayor at 10:00 am and Closed by the Mayor at 4:30 pm

The Tudor House – Doors open at 10:00 am and closes at 4:00 pm

At the Cathedral, Living History displays start at 10:00 pm and close at 4:00 pm

All the Living History in Worcester event sites and displays are free for the public to enter.

The Cathedral will have a cost of £2 – £3 for the Tower and Library tours only

Living History in Worcester VI is over three sites, Worcester's historic Guildhall, Tudor House Heritage Centre and Worcester Cathedral

In the main hall of the Guildhall there will be Living History displays for medieval, the soldiers of Napoleon and Wellingtons armies. There will be civilian and military displays of the American Civil Wars, re-enactors for the Zulu wars also the first and Second world wars In the courtroom Regimental and Society displays. In the High street there are marching and drill displays by the soldiers throughout the day.

The Tudor House Heritage Centre will be turning back the clocks and returning to the 1940's with the world at war Tudor House becomes the HQs for Worcester Home Guard and ARP plus civilians and some Germans appearing

On college Green will be a Living History camp with soldiers recovering and resting after the Battle of Worcester, there will be soldiers drilling, with muskets and canon firing during the day.

In the Cathedral Cloisters display by the battle of Worcester Society, fought 3rd September 1651 was then the final battle of the English Civil Wars. Find out about the Battle by visiting the Battle of Worcester Society display. Also Battle of Tewkesbury Society (Wars of the Roses) and the Battle of Evesham (Simon DeMontfort)

There will be a series of historic talks in the Guesten room in College Green

The Cathedral are also giving Guided tours of the Cathedral and the Tower telling the its part played during the battle of Worcester in 1651 plus the Cathedral Library will open for guided tours, on show will be documents of that period.
